Directions: Head east on Castle Pines Parkway/Hess Road past *The Canyons* (Canyonside Boulevard and Cross Canyon Trail), past Heirloom Parkway, all the way to Double Angel Road. When you arrive at the intersection of Hess Road and Double Angel Road, turn right/south through the main gate to Rueter-Hess Reservoir. Follow the road up the hill to the main parking area and shade structure.
